



Laikipia and Masai Mara Suggested Itinerary

Day 1:

Nairobi - Borana Lodge

This morning you are scheduled to arrive into Jomo Kenyatta International Airport where, after you have collected your luggage and cleared customs, you will be met by a representative from Offbeat Safaris and driven approximately 45 minutes to Wilson Domestic Airport for your scheduled flight to Lewa Downs.

On arrival you will be met a representative from Borana Lodge and transferred to the camp, in time for lunch.



Day 1- Day 4:

Borana Lodge (4 nights)

With panoramic views over the Samangua Valley and the Lewa Plains to the Ngare Ndare Forest and Mount Kenya beyond, The Lodge offers eight romantic and unique cottages, each with an open fireplace and private veranda. All areas of the Lodge overlook a lake that is a popular watering hole for the local animals so there is constant activity for guests to watch. Take a guide and walk down to the dam to enjoy a close-up view of elephants swimming!



Generations of the Dyer family have grown-up on this land and Borana welcomes children of all ages. At Borana we understand what children enjoy and are happy to ensure that their holiday experiences match that of their parents.

From swimming in the pool or a waterfall or exploring the river to riding on one of our horses or watching big game from one of our Land Rovers, Borana has much to offer children of all ages. The kitchen is always happy to cater to the gentler palettes and earlier hours that tend to suit younger guests and for those who need to be in bed before their parents, a listening service is always on hand.

Day 5: Borana Lodge – Masai Mara

This morning you will leave Borana after breakfast and be driven to Lewa Airstrip for your scheduled flight to Masai Mara. On arrival you will be met by an Offbeat Mara camp guide and driven to the camp.

Day 5 -8 Offbeat Mara Camp, Mara North Conservancy (4 nights)



Offbeat Mara Camp is a luxury semi-permanent camp situated on the Mara North Conservancy. This unspoilt part of Masai land is an area full of wildlife but far from any lodge. Offbeat Mara Camp employs and trains local Masai guides and works with the community employing many in the camp staff. The Mara offers amazing game viewing throughout the year and features the annual wildebeest migration in July – September.

Offbeat Mara offers a range of activities including walking, game-drives, night-drives and fishing. Guests are also able to visit the local school, markets and village. Balloon flights over the Mara can also be easily organised.



The camp sleeps up to 20 guests in four large double/twin en suite tents, and then a further three family tents, which are a double and twin unit, also with an en suite bathroom. These family units can also make for a lovely honeymooners tent, with more space and privacy. The en-suite bathrooms each have hot safari showers, wash basins and flush loos. The spacious tents are all furnished with large cedar beds, 24 hour solar lighting and the finest linen.



Informal dining is hosted in the mess tent or around the campfire. Delicious English breakfasts, lighter lunches and three course dinners are served each evening. Guests can also relax in the bar and living room tent, which is furnished with comfortable sofas, a writing desk, library and a fully stocked bar.



Day 9:

Offbeat Mara – Nairobi

After a delicious breakfast at the camp you will be back to the Mara North airstrip to take your scheduled flight back to Nairobi. On arrival you will be met by a representative who will transfer you to the international airport or hotel
